Photographer's diary

"So we were on Tern Island, right in the middle of the Pacific ... we saw a lot of this kind of thing ... some chicks manage to regurgitate the ingested plastic, I found regurgitated fishing gloves and a toothbrush, but often it just killed the chicks. We found lighters, bottle caps, toys, pens, markers, toothbrushes and miles of fishing line in dead chicks. I kept the pen from this bird for use as a teaching aid."
