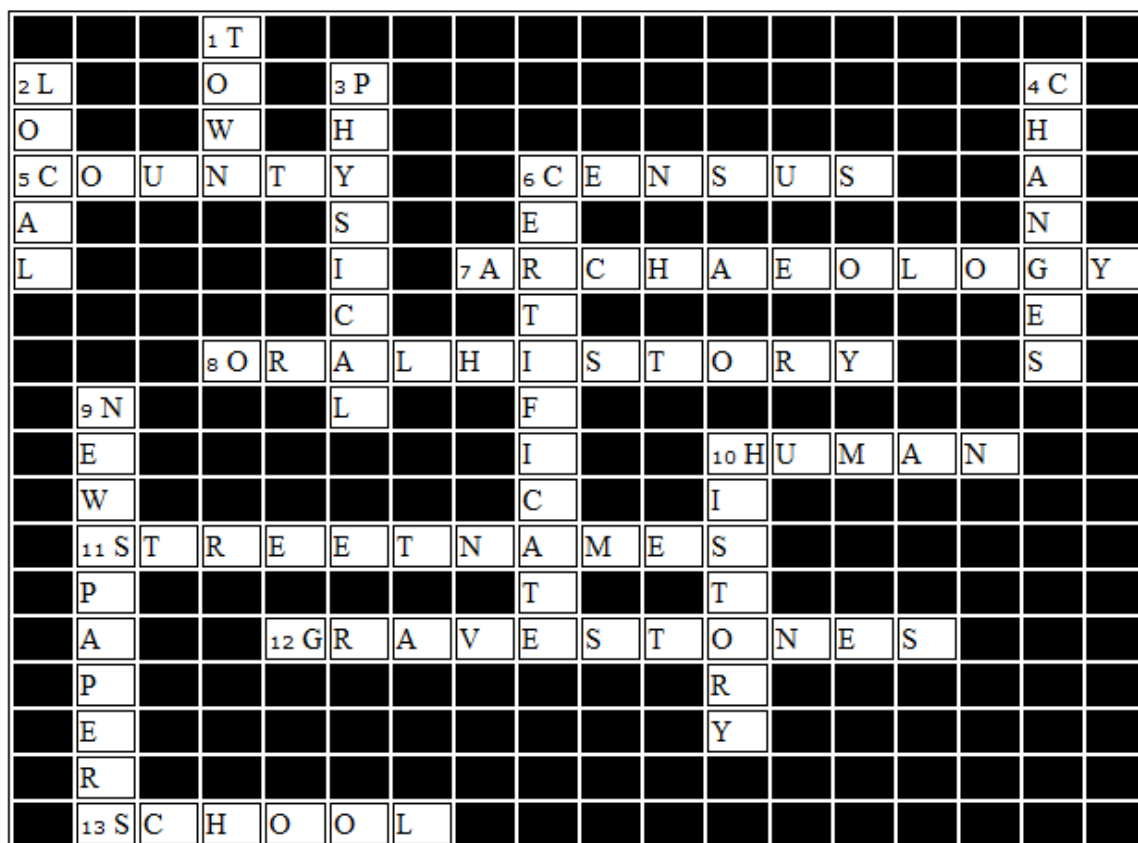


Crossword time!

Across

- There are 81 of these including Berkshire and Cumbria.
- The first was recorded in 1801.
- Digging up the past. This might tell us about the local area hundreds or thousands of years ago.
- People are a useful resource. They might record their personal experiences as one of these.
- This type of Geography looks at people and settlements. Most of the changes in the recent past will have been in this category.
- These can give us clues about the past. Without them we would find it very difficult to post letters.
- Found in most churchyards these can tell us about people who lived in the parish.
- A place where you spend a large amount of time and which has its own history.

Down

- Larger than a village and smaller than a city. This settlement could represent your local area.
- An area which could be as small as the area around your school or as large as your county.
- This type of Geography is unlikely to have changed much in the recent past.
- The local area is likely to have seen many of these in its history.
- Births, marriages and deaths all have to have one of these.
- The Times is an example. It was founded in 1785 and can give us useful information about the past.
- A subject at school looking back into the past.
