ACTIVITY THREE

- 1. Bangladesh in a low-lying country in South Asia located at 21-26°N. The country has a tropical monsoon climate with a hot, humid summer from March to June, a cooler monsoon season from June to September and a dry winter from October to March.
- 2. January is the coolest month, with temperatures around 26°C and April is the warmest month with temperatures around 35°C.
- 3. Most parts of the country receive over 2000mm of precipitation each year with 80% of it falling during the monsoon.
- 4. Northeastern Bangladesh receives the highest precipitation, being just south of the Himalayas.
- 5. Cyclones hit Bangladesh in April to May and September to November.
- 6. Bangladesh is very vulnerable to future changes in sea level.
