



Mountain Doctors

Specialist doctors are needed at Base Camp to monitor and treat mountaineers, climbers and trekkers. These doctors are especially trained to deal with high altitude conditions which affect people most commonly over 5000 metres as well as mountain accidents.

<u>Trekker</u>

Trekking to Everest Base Camp has become increasingly popular for both personal gain and as a charity fund raising event. Treks require people to be strong, fit walkers capable of walking all day over ten days. The treks take in the most breath-taking of scenery, including Mount Everest. A night, or two, is spent at Everest Base Camp, 'Tent City,' during which trekkers are immersed in the mountaineering atmosphere.

As the highest mountain in the world, at 8,848 metres, Mount Everest attracts many mountaineers and has become more popular in the last decade. Each mountaineer requires a strong team of people supporting them including Sherpas, trainers, cooks and doctors. Base Camp is a place for not only acclimatisation to high altitude but intense planning and information gathering about local weather and terrain conditions. Weeks can be spent at Base Camp waiting for the right conditions to make an attempt of climbing Everest. Whilst climbers make this difficult ascent many of their team wait at Base Camp for their return.

Why is it important for mountaineer's to stay at Base Camp for so long?

What do mountaineers, and their team do at Base Camp? What conditions make the stay at Base Camp difficult?
