

## Are you flood ready?



So the scientists can tell us there's a flood coming! This knowledge is useless if warnings are not sent out to people.

How do you send a message? How do you know if it's been read?

There are a number of flood warning techniques.

Some are traditional, so let's call them "20" Century" (meaning that they have been around for quite a few years) .

Some of them are more hi-tech, so let's call these "21st Century" (using digital technology, these have only been around for a few years).

Card sort into two piles 20th Century and "21st Century".

Visits from flood wardens (who may be police officers)	Warnings sent using SMS text messaging
Mobile loudhailers on vehicles	E-mail messages
Flood sirens (from the Second World War)	Digital TV and digital radio broadcast
Public address systems and loudspeakers	Real time film of rivers using web- cams
<b>Television broadcasts</b>	Remote-activated in-home alert systems (similar to smoke alarms and triggered using digital radio signals)
Radio broadcasts	Information posted on internet sites
Television teletext
